Mens names

- (1) niashalo'pəs "grandfather of 'with sewing'" (a slave who was adept at sewing and was named accordingly)
- (2) gitxə'n a foreign name, informant says gitlɔ'p, Beynon adds Haida.
- (3) gamksiwε' the word for white man, was used as a name. A nephew of this house. A man trapping in the hills met a white man. On his return he made a ^{replaca} duplicate and showed it in the halait, and took the name.
- (4) gasa'aot "gathering porcupine"
- (5) niashga'otx "grandfather of (kitlɔ'p word)"
- (6) gaxo' "grandfather" in Haida (?)
