Domination by Stikine Thngat Chief Shakes

- fishing
- trading monopoly

Culture - Concentration for salmon fishing (pocket climate, obstructions on rivers)

- assuming Thngat social organization

clans -
matrilined descent, crests, traditions

History :

- Pre-Thngat
- Thngat domination Wars with Kitwanoob etc
- Gold Rush. Telegraph Creek.
- Decline

also Inland Tlingit
