large though we saw but few natives. Their Chief is  
named Cuddah ... they have moved up the river  
for the benefit of fishing.

1791 Aug 22 anchored Tooschcondolth bearing north by  
west two miles distance. Comsuah came aboard.  
p 230 Few skins [Ingraham was anchored in McCoy cove]  
Auld.

p 233 "The principal tribes for skins reside at the three following  
villages Tooschcondolth, Masheet or Hancock's  
River and Tah tence.....

Totems

"The natives during the summer season live in scattered  
huts for the benefit of fishing the principal people  
living together these temporary huts are most wretched  
but their head villages are neatly and regularly built  
the houses end on with pitched roofs in front is a  
large post reaching above the roof neatly carved but  
with the most distorted figures at the bottom is an  
oval or round hole which is either the mouth or  
belly of some deformed object this serves for a door  
way near to these head villages they have  
fortified towns or villages which they call "Touts"  
to which they retreat when invaded by a more  
powerfull enemy.....

Masset

1791 Aug 18 [at Masset] \* I was employed sounding the river.  
... There were several small scattering villages, but there were visible traces of numerous tribes residing here at some season of the year, but those that came on board us made us understand their village was removed two days' journey up the river... p 294

Aug 22 made sail for Cumsva Village, Tooscondolth.

1792 Apr 18 WC Charlottes 53° 5' Indians came off  
" They were of the Tooscondolth tribe, subject to Comsrah... " p 320

1792 Apr 20 fr. Tadents

Apr 22 several canoes came off from Tadents' village

Apr 24 [Masset] natives wouldn't sell.

28 Leaving a letter with the Chief of the port, Cattar,  
p 324 sailed {Fn. can't be identified}

325 May 1/ " Cunnea the chief of Tadents came off... "

May 19 Anchored in Hope Cove [McLoy Cove] " Comsrah has at this time his town at least 4 leagues to the southward of the place where we lay ". p 330
