

Harda (Anthony Island)

Household was an avunculocal extended family
built around a core of related men in a
matrilineal lineage

Each lineage owned several houses in the village and
several resource areas

(Lineage or sib depending upon whether the members could
all trace back to an actual common ancestor, which we
do not know)

Two Raven lineages made up the Raven society (sub-society & host)
