

1/3 of way up (claim beyond of land beyond Miquaden Lake)

Portland Canal : The Tsetsant (different Tsetsant)

Boundary with Tsimshian in dispute - Kwenamass Bay,
Pearce Island


Tlingit (Tongass) neighbours, had earlier claim
to Kwenamass, Dundas Is., etc.

Eulachon Fisheries

eulachon

caught with herring rake

(net invented Kitimat)



bars to ripen

boiled, oil extracted

dried for food - not candles

Mouth of Nass - all Tsimshian came, Gitksan, Nuka, etc.

2 divisions:

1. Gitkateen git xat'i'n "people using fish traps"
 saltwater summer territories -
 villages on river near mouth

2. Gitanwiliks git'anwi'lks "people staying temporarily"
 (travel down from alghoves for
 excursions)

1. Gitkateen - didn't conform to usual definition of tribe.

Early village lax git xat'i'n at site of Greenville

Knew and split: to occupy 3 villages in 1850's

Angida 'an geds' "where use burning racks"

Gitlakans git lax'a'us "people on sandbar"

Kwunwog k'un w>'g' "where they sleep" - Chief Gitkun

first → Gitiks git'i'ks (-1905)

1867 Lincolith Anglican mission R Tomlinson knag,ɔ'li place of sale
 drew off some

1877 Greenville Methodist Lakalzap lax galzap on site of village
 drew more - by 1910. ← reverted to Anglican in 1905

gitgigε'nix "people upriver"

Gitgigenik split off because of a dispute, and moved upriver to

Andegulay 'an tagwalc' 'where happy'

Chief "Long-Arm" ^{Wolf} nagwa'son - across river to prevent people passing (Highest Chief on base)

^{Wolf} reply - sga t'i'n 'across weir'

- rejoined Kilkatens at Kilkatama & Greenville

Upriver - 2 tribes

Gitwanksi thk

gitwank si'tk^w
people where legends

place of legends

story of volcanic eruptions 200 yrs ago Lava flow

bay
dog salmon

lake washed away

si'aks "new water" formed again

new lake
