The performer went about the village throwing eagle down to represent snow, inviting people to ceremonies.
3. mu.t wamg.an.
4. ati.g.ɛ'nəx "without trail" (the frog) ✓
5. wa.dzi.xs.k'ɛ'dət "quarrelsome person", naxnɔ'g.  
The performer provoked quarrels with his guests ✓
6. g.anɔ'.dzət for ksəm.g.anɔ'.dzət "woman of dwarf people", a naxnɔ'g name.  
"When the performer comes into the hall it the people clapped their hands." He wore a mask representing a woman. ✓
7. 'wi.'na'g.ɛ'dzə "large wolverine", naxnɔ'g.
8. a.ki'ng.a.su "crowding person", naxnɔ'g. ✓  
Performer interfered with guests eating.
9. qaləxshu'i's "through rain" or leaking roof, a naxnɔ'g. ✓  
The guests got wet.

The woman performer would lie in the middle of  
the room, "and the medicine men who were the chiefs  
guests would sing their suwa'nsu songs over her.
3. tkuwalcɪtkumgi'ks "prince, far off (seaward)"  
naxnɔ'q names
4. xtamba'n "blanket belly" (frog)  
The frog used his belly as a blanket
5. taɔwɔma'q "motion of lower jaw, mouth" (small frog)  
The frog moves its lower jaw while croaking

6 'mən k'a'og  
 'mən k'a'ot kwən g.ana'-'o  
 upward movements of mouth frog

k'a'ot also means sexual intercourse; the meaning is intentionally ambiguous.

2. xpigig'et 4 children on a pole
3. g.an'a'odzənax shadows  
painted red or black on leather robe
4. tin fish weir wi:ta'mg.ən was proper name. It was made as a ceremonial entrance, so that guests were "caught in trap".  
Crest, not naxnəq.
