





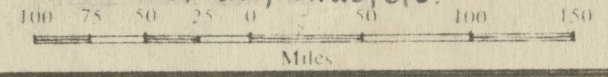





ABORIGINAL OCCUPATIONS

(UTILIZATION OF FOOD RESOURCES)

-  **SEA-SHORE TRIBES** :- Salmon of creeks and river mouths, eulachon, sea-fish, sea-mammals, shellfish, sea-weeds.
-  **MARITIME ORIENTATION** :- As above, with strong offshore orientation (Sea-mammals, halibut)
-  **DOWNRIVER FISHING TRIBES** :- Major salmon runs, eulachons, trout, etc. Access to sea resources of related tribes. Land hunting also important
-  **UPRIVER FISHING TRIBES** :- Salmon runs major food source, but hunting etc important.
-  **RIVER-ORIENTED HUNTING TRIBES** :- Hunting more important than fishing, although fish still an important food
-  **INLAND HUNTING TRIBES** :- Fish of negligible importance. Hunters of bison (Kootenay), caribou, deer, moose

Note: Only dominant and characteristic occupations shown. All tribes also gathered berries, roots, etc., and all hunted and trapped land mammals, birds, etc.
