gitxa'ta , general

General Notes (Beypoon, 1916)

hε:l is the recognized chief of the gitxa'ta people, who in former years held a position next to the Tsumshuan (Pt Simpson) and were very strong in war

Language is very much the same as Pt Simpson, there being no difference in the pronunciation but a slight difference in the meaning of words. They have also introduced some Ketumat and Bella Bella words into the language.

The people adhere to ancient ceremonies more than Pt Simpson. (Informant Sam Lewis went to chief to get permission to give information, and turned over his payment to chief, who let him retain some of it.) (Informants held out for 75¢ /hr, which Barbeau had paid on a few occasions in Pt Simpson the year before.)

Informant refused to translate names until she received permission of the different chiefs.
