B.C. during the winter 1934-1935.

blind from the effects of exposure.
I have the story of Estevill, from
the Naas; the T'Sao box, & a story
from the Queen Charlottes. He also
told me the story of the man who
fell from heaven, but I cannot
find it among my papers. The
stone with the imprint of the man
is on the smaller inner passage
between Inchtakate & Prince
Rupert, but I am sure you know

I have no typewriter, but I have
some of the stories copied out, &
I shall try & get them finished
soon, & shall send them to you
then.

It was entirely Stephen Ryan's own idea
to tell me the stories; I am only sorry
there are not more, & that I cannot find
the notes of the story of the man who fell
from heaven - but I am sure you already
have that story.
