I was a missionary at git'ama't one year. They marry within their own crest. There are two royal houses at git'ama't: tsɔci'o, who is supposed to come from the north, and those who had always been there, 'niɔskwɔladzi'o. These houses are both taxskik; and they marry with one another (although they could not marry within their own house)

endogamy

In the same village they have ganha'dos but not as high standing as the other two houses. They also intermarry with them.

The Bella Bellas marry in the same crest; and the China Hat people, gidztsui, and the git'ama't
