

Edenshaw

"Lunia lived to a ripe old age, and when he died Edenshaw succeeded him... He has shown me papers written by Captain Douglas referring to the courage and honesty of Black Lunia" (1912. Harrison)

Name does not appear in logs of the 1790's.

1809 Log of ship "Hamilton" of Boston mentions Odensu (Barbeau HM 136) at OCI.

1817 Rogvetenil Sept 29 "Itemtchov the head chief of Masait came in a handsome canoe, accompanied by his three wives. His face is long, a little narrow and savage, and has something of the Swiss character... He thought I wanted to change names with him... The exchange was made, notwithstanding the difficulty the chief found in pronouncing his new name, which, to oblige him, I softened to Roki" p 89

The next day the ship went aground and large numbers of canoes swarmed around, seemingly threatening attack. Itemtchov made a speech and chased them away "This man has a feeling heart, and this, perhaps, prevented all hostile attacks from his subjects" p. 90

1829 Apr 23 Kigance "The Masait Indians, who now occupy North Island, are here at present on business. Eadiashu, one of their chiefs" was seen on board Eadiashu, chief of the Masait tribe" p 69

1884 Chittenden. [Masait] is the abode of the aristocracy of Hyda land - of Head Chief Edensaw, and of Weeah, Stilla, Kinackilaa, Kiltstoria, Spencer and Cootay... Chief Edensaw and most of his people were away at North Island and other points hunting fur seal...

Visit from Edensaw... about 75... oldest and ranking

chief of the Hydah nation --- he saved the crew of the Susan Sturgess."

1883 Swan Aug 6 left Utteवास for North Island with Edinso, chief of North Island --- formerly lived at a village called Kioosta p 142 "old Edinso" - excellent pilot along West Coast.

Swanton Eda'nsa chief of E21 - Stastas or Sa'ingal lands p 275 town chief of Kivsta p 281 owned house at ^{White} / ^{LA} (on of 3 houses) E21c

" " " " ^{King} ^{Kivsta} (Old Edinso's) had house there too.

Harrison Chief Edinshaw
Born (guess date) 1812 at a village which "has disappeared, but if reports be true it was situated near Cape Bell ..."
Had 2 elder bro.

Lived at Skidegate until he succeeded his uncle "a most powerful chief at Dadans near Cape Knox, and bore the hereditary name of Edinso" - "as chief of Shongath Lennas, who had their hg at Dadans near North Island"

[Harrison confuses Dadans with Kivsta]

Baptized by Harrison ALBERT EDWARD after King had 2 sons, George and Henry

1852 - Susan Sturgess episode pp. 171-174.

1853 - Capt Houston of HMS Toncomalee visited Edinshaw at Dadans

- Capt JC Prevost, "Satellite", used Ed. as pilot. ^{Vivago?}

[which one?] Edinshaw was in Viet. when smallpox came

1894 Nov 16. died, Masset.

Colonist obit June 26 1894?

born Aithin's kwun Cball 1810-15

1842 (?) - 185? - living at No Island.
