Ne-coon of prob. Ne-kwun or Rose Spit. "I... quite recently I have seen the ruins of this ancient village. When I first saw Rose Spit, no sign of any village could be seen, everything was covered with a broad-bladed grass growing on a sandy soil. The cattle having destroyed this grass exposed the bare sand again to the elements and the wind has now blown the sand further inland, and thus laid bare again the remains of Ne-coon or Ne-kwun village."

1852 - Susan Sturgess episode

1853 - Capt Houston of HMS *Townshale* visited ^{Edenshaw} him at Dadas

- "J.C. Prevost", HMS *Satellite*, used Edenshaw as pilot.

Edenshaw in Victoria - smallpox,

Edenshaw baptized by Harrison ALBERT EDWARD after King Edward

Douglas & Gunia:

Douglas visited North Island and anchored at Dadans. One chief's name was Gunia "and on account of a very dark complexion he was called Black Gunia". Warned Douglas of attempt to take the vessel. Exchanged names, "and ever after Gunia was known as Captain Douglas. Gunia lived to a ripe old age, and when he died Edenshaw succeeded him... He has shown me papers written by Captain Douglas referring to the courage and honesty of Black Gunia..."

June 29, 1912

Reason for move to Alaska: "at Dadans... the most powerful of these [West Coast] tribes receded. In ancient times they frequently harassed the Zambians and the neighbouring tribes of the Hadas. At last, the Zambians, aided by the Hadas at Massett and Skidegate and elsewhere banded together to overcome all these powerful tribes on the west coast. The fighting continued for several years, and finally the west coast Hadas were defeated. Reduced to desperation and disgusted with their brother Hadas who had joined the Zambians to conquer their territory, 400 warriors left their exceptionally fine fishing and hunting grounds and migrated to the southern portions of the Sound of Wales Island, now in Alaska. They afterwards founded the villages of Kassan, Kijani, Houkan and several other villages..."

No 52 Aug 26
1912

Chief Edenshaw - died at Massett Nov 16, 1894 E-din-50 "waterfall" (G-thingt)

Got name when succeeded his uncle as chief of Shong a 1/4 Tennas, who had their hq. at Dadans, near North Island. His birth name was Gwai-go-un/thin, "the man who rests his head on an island"

"He will say he was born has disappeared, but if reports be true it was set on C Ball on the eastern shore of Br Is at 40 to 45 m fr Skid. Guess date of birth 1812. 2 older bro. Made Skidegate his home until appointed chief. "The uncle he succeeded was a most powerful chief at Dadans near Cape Knox, and bore the hereditary name of Edinso." 1851 Kennedy at Simpson asked about gold quartz. Led to Gold Mts

Rose Spit

Somewhat there were two villages ~~at~~ near Rose Spit, in fact one was at the Spit and the other near Cape Fife.

No 2. Sept 9

When HBC located at Massett... they all consented to abandon their scattered villages and form on large village... When I arr. all these northern Hadas had made Mass. their hq during the

"Massett" may be a corruption of Mazaredo, Casamano's name
for Massett. 1792
or De Fonte 1640 Mynhasset

- 1753 HBC opened a trading post at Massett. Virago chartered area
1860 Alert in area
1862 Hecate sent - disturbance between miners & natives at Skeneville.
1876 Colleson to Massett for several yrs.
1883 Harrison arr. Massett.

"Very little was known etc. (of minerals until 1858)

C.P.N. had several vessels, incl Princess Louise, Sardonys, R.P. Ketch, The Islander. -- brought expedition parties to Massett under the guidance of --- Capt. J. Irving. One was Sept 1890 in which Harrison left.

Capt Douglas found Cunia, on account of his very dark complexion was called BLACK GUNIA

Exchanged names. ever after Cunia was known as "Captain Douglas".
