Cumshewa (Hikénul) ^{In explanation of the name Cumshewa it is said that a sailor, whose name the natives pronounce 65'nsewa, disappeared from a trading vessel. One day the crew saw a man approaching the vessel on a canoe, and taking him to be the missing man they called him by name. It proved to be the Hikénul chief, who thus acquired the name. p 189}
