

Crests (general)

Eagle Crests by Wallace (Kyau)

1. *xskii-k* pot^z of *larskit*
 2. *spsz-1* differences in use between chiefs & lekak.
 3. *txdo* & *naxnagam*. otto
 4. *hat'sa'lt*
 5. *xskemsm* - used by only a few, including *g.tw.igots*
sgaqget (*sasasaaxt* etc)
 "A chief who has a crest of whatever kind may lend it to his brothers, but it has to be returned to the owner"
 6. "ne" *gamqet* - used only by *gispaxlits* & *g.tands* chiefs, not *lekakiget*. (TP. of *legex*)
 7. *heitkm* *spsz-1* TP *sgaqget*. lekak. don't stand it erect.
 8. *nagam q'z-g.3* *spsz-1* (grouned) used by some *lekak* of *g.twi.igots*.

TPs.

Haadas
mix crests

"The Haadas mix their crests on poles, but we never mix the crests. We represent only the crests of one's own tribe on posts. See p 84 The Apostle of Alaska.

9. *gwusmaki-* + garment of weavers - used by 3 phratries in different forms. *Eg larskit* form is used by *gwunku-t* only (and not all of them).
 10. *g.alkharts* cormorant hat. Worn by chiefs *legex*, *sgaqget*, and *yooss*. Certain *lekakiget* have myths about it but are afraid to use it because the chiefs use it.
 11. *g.iabalk* - HF w. book *sgaqget* only.
 14. *xskigam* 176 stone eagle. Kept as crest by chiefs *legex* and *sg.sq.zmdzi'us* (not others).
 15. *lagw.yo'-6* fine of dirt.
 mixes dirt and oolachen grease and burns it. Has

logotx

exclusive crest, invented by him and done only once.
If he died, sgawet could use it, but would have
to give it back when someone took the name logotx.
Other crests have types of fishes as crests too, but
with different names.

- (16) ataa'aks "early drinking" - a custom used as a dzepk by all laxskik houses. When they see someone come into their house early in the morning and take a drink, they give him a gift.
- (17) nlu'stka'm xskik eagles nest. Used in several forms by several laxskik.
- (18) qata'ksam xskik claws of eagle. dzepk used by all laxskik but only carved on spoons.
- (19) lagaxwe'ss - a gosp crest. Laxskik have it too but only refer to it in songs.

General on crests, from account of ni-stkamik's crests
by Swanson, Tate (Ryean), 1915.

- modik - a ptex and a dzepk.

Account of how whole animal is compensated when chief builds a house, or when copper is broken when he dies. One of Iskakiget has hereditary task of using it for royal chief in this way. (Used by all royal Temp. chiefs)?
Iskakiget cannot use it in this way.

- next

- galk or a'te - mesabaxs, klagac, hukutak (all worn together).

Not worn by young people of the house at their cotsi'tse (standing, or taking higher rank, or becoming a chief). All the royal chiefs wore it at some time on their chubt, but now they would wear the twelsgam "next" or geidam modik.

Only the Tsimshian people have a story for it, but all qispas may use it (It may have misinterpreted this).

- ga'idam ge'li - hat of grizzly paws. There was an argument between Swanson on Tate on whether or not all qisp may use it. Tate finally agreed that any qisp 1st. could use it at a feast, and it was a dzepk.

- gardam or modik same, but seems to carry higher rank.

- tkweskagam - next - headdress decorated with abalone "They call it tkweskagam on account of the pearls" and used by chiefs only.

- lanengait with 10 discs (on top of grizzly head) 10 disc lanengait us used only by tsibase and a's tkumik. Iskakiget of all phratris use lanengarts, but only with 4 or 5 discs.
xski'tk is their ptex and dzepk.

medisk is listed as a general crest of the Taxk. bu.

"grizzly bear of the mountains"

This crest was not general among the qispawudwads.
The grizzly bear of the hills was not used by them
excepting 4 houses - tsibasa (qitxata) 3. nisshaiwexs
(qitsitas) 3. 'alim laxa (qinaxang. ik) + nissnawa (q.
qiludzau) "and only these royal houses have been given
the privilege to use this by consent of the Taxk. bu people."

The tkawekskam medisk is the sole crest of
tsibasa and no one else. The rest of the qispawudwads
use the medigm dzauw. raks "the grizzly of the sea"
and the grizzly of the hills was used by all the Taxk. bu
people in general.
