In my first letter, I indicate that we would start on the first week of January, but now the people will son be scattered to work some pat place else and the applicatio procedureas well as other procedureswould take time, therefore if our application is accepted I suggest that we start in October 1974; there will be several classes of songs, say welsome songs for other chiefs who invites the Kitwancoll chiefs, Peace songs, lamentaion songs; War peace songs; Divorce songs as far as we can remember.
