Wolcott cruise 1875

passed BB = Metlak - stopped Ft Simpson  
(Gosby)

Crosby had induced Indians to give up heather  
ways and remove carved bearded fellows.

Some burned, others in a sort of museum. Swan  
got one 40'. and others promised him.

Klawak - dancing rattles & conjuring sticks

couldnt buy any Howkan totems

July 2 Klemmakooan [Klukwan] on Cordova Bay  
purch bracelets rings, ear ornaments of gold & silver

very early  
his wife was  
Eunice's sister

Chief of Klemmekwan was a half breed named  
Kanowen, a celebrated silvermith  
(wont sell poles)

Yahsoot, chief.

6th. Kazan, at Kasta Bay, ashore at trading post  
of Barmovitch.  
bought embroidery, Cuckat Shawl, bracelets

Was Kagwanchoza  
the chief  
Saxnet

Wrangell - Geo. Martin, a  $\frac{1}{2}$  Harda bred whose Indian  
name is Sangat, wife Kwaklen or Annee  
Martin, and son Sammy or Yethl - now.  
- bought a painted box

Tongass.

Pt Simpson - Swan bought totem pole \$120 from widows  
his best a  $\frac{1}{2}$  br still in box

Belle Belle - McKennedy<sup>HBC</sup> - later sent him valuable  
collection of ancient articles and 26 large  
ornamented paddles for the big canoe
