Kisgaga's Territories

malu'laq

- ① From Kesgagas village to Bear Lake, including sagig's-t Creek (Shelagyote)
- ② Above the Bear Lake river, Kcew'aks, [Sustut R.] and near Sustut Lake.
- ③ Mountain for goats south of ~~Kesgagas~~ Babine River [Mt. Thomsen?]

wimənō'zak (also wist'is)

- ① From 5th Cabin up to Groundhog Mountain. The old Stikine Trail is in this land. [On old map, Damdochax Lake is called Blackwater Lake. Perhaps Damdochax R. is Blackwater R.]

kcamgitgige'nix

- ① On the trail over the mountains to galdō - 15 miles long by 2 wide.

alē'ist

- ① 30 x 15 miles, north of Sustut R.

nikap

- ① 20 x 15 miles north east of Skeena

wigaix

- ① Junction of Bear [Sustut] and Skeena.
Up the Skeena about 20 miles to kcegwinxyu'n Cr
"waters of juice of moose" [Moosek?], and up the
Sustut 20 miles to kcelulaxama'uxst
waters in on me by open flat

Informant says pitbangax is away below here.

- ② A long stretch of land called 'angilgala'nasu
"the back of the headwaters", extending from the back of
Kegagas Mountain, tsam'anmagit "inside climbing"
[Shedun Peak?]. Reached by climbing over a glacier.
Includes the upper part of saqigst (Shelagyo Cr)
for beaver. Extends past another mountain called
laxs'iyu'n "on glacier" [Shelagyo Peak?] to
Bear River territory.

Used for groundhog, mountain goat, mountain
sheep, marten, beaver.

xstutxumlaxε (or 'ananamg.št)

- ① 30 miles long by 20 wide next to those of a/ε:ist
n.e. of Skeena.

nts

- ① 20 miles long, next to wimanzək

gunianitu

- ① 10 x 10

axnatxəm wil

① 20 long x 15 wide

wai get

① 15 miles long (groundhog) between gunani'tx and wig.aix. This legend goes back to the Pass, so they are not entitled to much here.

Beynon note (undated) The g,sg.aga's formerly lived in a village near Bear Lake on the Kcain, called gitg.ala'a'n x g,sg. Before that they came from a village near 4th Cabin, 50 miles above on the Skeena; ~~and near this~~. Iu'o'nkca'x; and near this was the old village of git'ang.a's'xk; and above this was a river that branched into the Skeena. Iuha'ttanta there were the Stikines and about 30 miles above this the hunting grounds of ge'l which was called con'aq'lo'u (groundhog) on the Skeena River. ???
